Lakeshore Update: Wind turbines discussed at Tuesday meeting

MANITOWOC — The Manitowoc County Parks and Planning Commission will hold a meeting to discuss a potential ordinance regulating wind turbines at 6 p.m. Tuesday at the county Office Complex, 4319 Expo Drive, Manitowoc.

With a Minneapolis-based energy company eyeing northern Manitowoc County as a potential spot for turbines, the county is meeting with affected townships to hammer out an ordinance to regulate the placement and operation of the turbines.

A meeting was held Aug. 31. The township boards of Two Creeks, Mishicot and Two Rivers asked for an additional meeting before the ordinance goes to the Manitowoc County Board for a vote.

The Manitowoc County Board will meet at 7 p.m. Sept. 21 at UW-Manitowoc, 705 Viebahn St.
